Curriculum and Academics:

- Cleveland Community College and PCA hosted an informational meeting on Tuesday, March 8th to discuss college course opportunities for Pinnacle students in their 11th and 12th grade years. CCC brought some really cool equipment such as a welding simulator and all of their faculty did a fantastic job presenting. Mr. Fogleman did a marvelous job with the question and answer session and we had over 60 individuals in attendance.
- On Wednesday, April 6th Dr. Martin and Ms. Wittrock organized and hosted the career fair for high school students. Students were able to choose from 14 different sessions and attend two based on their interests and skills. Classical Foundations Program (CFP) Update April 4, 2022

- T. K. Coleman of the Foundation for Economic Education has produced videos related to the school's ten values. A video on esteem will be shown on April 8. At the request of middle school students, the video program will be expanded from grades 8-12 to grades 6-12 next year.
- 2. Dr. Antony Davies (Duquesne University) and Dr. James Harrigan (American Institute for Economic Research) spoke to our high school students on March 29. The press release follows.

Professor Antony Davies and Dr. James Harrigan spoke to high school students at Pinnacle Classical Academy on March 29 about the interaction of our nation's founding principles with economics.

Dr. Davies is associate professor of economics at Duquesne University, the Milton Friedman Distinguished Fellow at the Foundation for Economic Education. He has written a book on understanding statistics, and written hundreds of op-eds for the *Wall Street Journal* and other newspapers. His YouTube videos on economics, government, and policy have garnered millions of views.

Dr. Harrigan is Senior Editor at the American Institute for Economic Research. Dr. Harrigan was previously Dean of the American University of Iraq-Sulaimani, and later served as Director of Academic Programs at the Institute for Humane Studies and Strata, where he was also a Senior Research Fellow. He has written extensively for the popular press, with articles appearing in the Wall Street Journal, USA Today, U.S. News & World Report, and other outlets.

Dr. Davies and Dr. Harrigan are co-hosts of the Words & Numbers podcast and co-authors of *Cooperation or Coercion?*

"Students deepened their knowledge of inflation, the budget deficit, the national debt, and other issues and concerns they will face after graduation," said Dr. Shelly Bullard, the school's headmaster. "We are grateful to Professor Davies and Dr. Harrigan for sharing their knowledge and insights with our students and faculty!"

Located in Shelby, Pinnacle Classical Academy is a free public charter school that attracts 1,077 students from five counties. Pinnacle students' proficiency rate on state tests exceeds that of all 115 of the state's local school districts, and the 31 seniors in the class of 2022 have already been offered a combined \$2,685,720 in four-year scholarship awards.

Robert L. Luddy is a business and educational entrepreneur. A graduate of LaSalle University and a U.S. Army veteran, Luddy purchased a sheet metal shop in 1981 and transformed it into CaptiveAire Systems, leading manufacturer of commercial kitchen ventilation systems in North America. Today, CaptiveAire employs over 1000 employees, with 90 sales offices nationwide and sales over \$300 million in 2015. However, Bob Luddy is more than just a businessman, he is a champion for children's education and a school choice advocate.

In 1998, Bob established Franklin Academy, a public charter school in Wake Forest, which now serves over 1,200 K-12 students. In 2001, Bob founded St. Thomas More Academy, a private Catholic college preparatory high school in Raleigh. In 2007, Bob opened Thales Academy, a growing chain of independent Pre-K-12 schools offering high-quality education at an affordable tuition. The Luddy Schools are quickly growing, with nearly 3,000 students enrolled throughout the Raleigh area.

John Hood is president of the John William Pope Foundation, a Raleigh-based grantmaker that supports public policy organizations, educational institutions, arts and cultural programs, and humanitarian relief in North Carolina and beyond.

Hood also served as chairman of the board at the John Locke Foundation from 2015-2021. Hood helped found Locke in 1989 and served as its president from 1995 to 2014.

Since 1986, Hood has written a syndicated column on politics and public policy for North Carolina newspapers. It currently appears regularly in the *Winston-Salem Journal*, Greensboro *News & Record*, Asheville *Citizen-Times*, Wilmington *Star-News*, and newspapers in 50 other communities. Hood is a frequent commentator for radio and television stations and teaches at Duke University's Sanford School of Public Policy.

Hood is the author of eight books, the latest of which is a Revolutionary War-themed historical-fantasy novel entitled *Mountain Folk* (2021). Hood's other books include *Catalyst: Jim Martin and the Rise of North Carolina Republicans* (2015), *Our Best Foot Forward: An Investment Plan for North Carolina's Economic Recovery* (2012), *Selling the Dream: Why Advertising is Good Business* (2005), *Investor Politics* (2001), *The Heroic Enterprise: Business and the Common Good* (1996), and two volumes of family history.

A former Bradley Fellow at the Heritage Foundation, Hood writes and comments frequently for national media outlets. His articles have appeared in magazines such as *Readers' Digest, National Review, The New Republic, Military History*, and *Reason* as well as newspapers such as *The Wall Street Journal* and *USA Today*.

At Locke, Hood created the E.A. Morris Fellowship for Emerging Leaders, which prepares young North Carolinians for leadership roles in the public and private sectors. He also serves on the faculty and as board chairman of the N.C. Institute of Political Leadership; as co-chair of the North Carolina Leadership Forum, based at Duke University; as vice-chair of the James G. Martin Center for Academic Renewal and the Carolina Liberty Foundation; and on the boards of directors of the State Policy Network, the Student Free Press Association, and North Carolinians for Redistricting Reform.

Hood received his B.A. in journalism from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He earned a M.A. in liberal studies and a graduate certificate in nonprofit management from UNC-Greensboro. Hood currently serves on the UNC-Chapel Hill Board of Visitors. He is a Mecklenburg County native and currently resides in Wake County with his wife, two sons, and a stepdaughter.
