Classical Foundations Program (CFP) Update November 4, 2022

- 1. Dr. Eric Daniels, Assistant Director of the Lyceum Honors Program at Clemson University, spoke to Logic and Rhetoric classes on September 26 and was interviewed for *Dare to Soar*.
- 2. The Classical Foundation Program's fall 2022 lecturer recommended by advisory board member Matthew Morgen was Dr. Ben Bayer, fellow and director of content at the Ayn Rand Institute. Dr. Bayer spoke to high school students on November 3 on Rand's novel *Anthem,* which is part of the school's eighth-grade curriculum. He was interviewed for *Dare to Soar* and gave a talk to faculty on the relationship between lecture/presentation and discussion in the classroom.
- 3. The Classical Foundation Program's spring 2023 lecturer recommended by advisory board member Thomas Pack is Albert Eisenberg, co-founder of the Philadelphia-based media company Broad+Liberty. The date of the lecture will be arranged in the weeks ahead.
- 4. Mr. John Hood has agreed to be our 2023 graduation speaker on **Saturday**, **June 3**, **2023**. His biography:

John Hood is president of the John William Pope Foundation, a Raleigh-based grantmaker that supports public policy organizations, educational institutions, arts and cultural programs, and humanitarian relief in North Carolina and beyond.

Hood also served as chairman of the board at the John Locke Foundation from 2015-2021. Hood helped found Locke in 1989 and served as its president from 1995 to 2014.

Since 1986, Hood has written a syndicated column on politics and public policy for North Carolina newspapers. It currently appears regularly in the *Winston-Salem Journal*, Greensboro *News & Record*, Asheville *Citizen-Times*, Wilmington *Star-News*, and newspapers in 50 other communities. Hood is a frequent commentator for radio and television stations and teaches at Duke University's Sanford School of Public Policy.

Hood is the author of eight books, the latest of which is a Revolutionary War-themed historical-fantasy novel entitled *Mountain Folk* (2021). Hood's other books include *Catalyst: Jim Martin and the Rise of North Carolina Republicans* (2015), *Our Best Foot Forward: An Investment Plan for North Carolina's Economic Recovery* (2012), *Selling the Dream: Why Advertising is Good Business* (2005), *Investor Politics* (2001), *The Heroic Enterprise: Business and the Common Good* (1996), and two volumes of family history.

A former Bradley Fellow at the Heritage Foundation, Hood writes and comments frequently for national media outlets. His articles have appeared in magazines such as *Readers' Digest, National Review, The New Republic, Military History,* and *Reason* as well as newspapers such as *The Wall Street Journal* and *USA Today*. At Locke, Hood created the E.A. Morris Fellowship for Emerging Leaders, which prepares young North Carolinians for leadership roles in the public and private sectors. He also serves on the faculty and as board chairman of the N.C. Institute of Political Leadership; as co-chair of the North Carolina Leadership Forum, based at Duke University; as vice-chair of the James G. Martin Center for Academic Renewal and the Carolina Liberty Foundation; and on the boards of directors of the State Policy Network, the Student Free Press Association, and North Carolinians for Redistricting Reform.

Hood received his B.A. in journalism from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He earned a M.A. in liberal studies and a graduate certificate in nonprofit management from UNC-Greensboro. Hood currently serves on the UNC-Chapel Hill Board of Visitors. He is a Mecklenburg County native and currently resides in Wake County with his wife, two sons, and a stepdaughter.

• Individual teacher meetings have started to discuss teacher growth and proficiency goals. I strongly believe this makes a valuable impact on the instruction and commitment that we see from our teachers.

- Our staff participated in a lecture presented by Dr. Ben Bayer who came highly recommended by the Classical Foundation Program's national advisory board.
- PLCs are meeting regularly across all grade levels. We continue to focus on school, teacher and student data in these meetings. Each meeting starts with reviewing our school goals.

• Testing

• We completed the PreACT and the first round of NC Check-Ins. We have decided to add the National Latin Test to our offerings to students this year. This will give us another method to evaluate our Classical program.

- We are completing annual reviews and working on several referrals in our Exceptional Children's department. We are always working to provide our EC students the best level of support possible.
- We are completing 504 annual reviews and working on referrals. We are constantly working with teachers to provide appropriate accommodations.
- We are working with Engligh Language Learners on vocabulary and reading comprehension skills to support them academically and socially.
