Goals for the 2021-22 School Year:

- We have set three goals for the 2021-22 school year and have outlined them for the staff. Each big task we set in motion this year we would like to make sure it meets one of these three goals. This will keep us focused on the mission of Pinnacle Classical Academy. The three goals are as follows:
 - Increase student proficiency to 85% as a school as well as increase student growth.
 - Increase PCA pride
 - Create a positive school culture.

Curriculum and Academics:

- We are very excited about our EOG and EOC data for the 2020-21school year. In comparison to the county and state we did exceptionally well. We did take a slight dip last year that we plan to correct this school year. Mr. Ziegler has provided a comparison of PCA to the state and county.
- T.K. Coleman came on Friday, August 27th as a representative from FEE to kick-off our character traits videos. The students hung onto every word and his presentation has led to several discussions in classes, lunch, and in general. The students were very receptive to his presentation and we are excited to see how this helps catapult our character education lessons each month.
- Extracurricular activities have started. We are in the process of beginning several new clubs and continuing with many we have had for several years. Clubs and other student led organizations will make the students feel connected to Pinnacle. This is also a great opportunity for students to develop leadership, communication, and organizational skills.

Professional Development:

- PLC's are meeting regularly for all of grades 4, 5, Middle School, and High School. We are currently using this time to relay important information about school opening, expectations, lesson planning, COVID protocols, etc. We have also started looking at school, grade level, and individual data. Mrs. Richardson is leading the 4th and 5th grade PLCs and I am leading the middle school and high school meetings.
- Tech Talk Tuesdays are starting on September 14th. Joseph Hurdt and Steve Putnam will be offering several virtual meetings to teachers to problem solve and explore new ways to use technology in their classroom. On September 1, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction released 2020-21 School Assessment Data.¹ Here is a summary of the results for Pinnacle Classical Academy, Cleveland County Schools, and the State of North Carolina (percent of students scoring at or above Achievement Level 3: grade level proficient).

- 3. David Higham Associates, which holds the copyright to Dorothy Sayers's works, has granted us permission to reprint *Lost Tools of Learning*, the essay on which our charter is based, and the Ayn Rand Institute has done the same for *Teaching Johnny to Think*. As of September 1, Wes Westmoreland and Jeff Ziegler have (almost) completed drafting an introduction to a book in which *Lost Tools of Learning* and *Teaching Johnny to Think* will be reprinted. The book will be published in time for the Classical Liberals in the Carolinas 2021 Annual Conference.
- 4. On October 14-16, the Classical Liberals in the Carolinas 2021 Annual Conference will take place in Shelby. Some events will take place at Pinnacle Classical Academy. The topic of the conference is "A Free Market Approach to Education"; Jeff Ziegler will take part in a panel discussion devoted to K-12 school choice. Today, CaptiveAire employs over 1000 employees, with 90 sales offices nationwide and sales over \$300 million in 2015. However, Bob Luddy is more than just a businessman, he is a champion for children's education and a school choice advocate.

In 1998, Bob established Franklin Academy, a public charter school in Wake Forest, which now serves over 1,200 K-12 students. In 2001, Bob founded St. Thomas More Academy, a private Catholic college preparatory high school in Raleigh. In 2007, Bob opened Thales Academy, a growing chain of independent Pre-K-12 schools offering high-quality education at an affordable tuition. The Luddy Schools are quickly growing, with nearly 3,000 students enrolled throughout the Raleigh area.



In October, we will be taking our first round of NC Check-Ins. Our high school students and 8th graders will be taking the PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, and PSAT.
